General Assembly

The Presbyterian General Assembly this year was held in St Kentigern's College, Pakuranga, Auckland. The venue was great, but the weather was atrocious: wet, cold and windy.

Commissioners gathered from all around New Zealand. This year, our name tags gave only our name and Presbytery of origin. There was no indication whether each person was an elder or a minister. This made for a great atmosphere of equality and collegiality.

The Assembly was wrapped in worship, from the opening service on Wednesday evening to the closing service on Sunday morning. We were led in devotions each morning, and prayers were offered frequently during each day.

Commissioners do not represent their parish, but vote as individual people. Debates took place in a spirit of respect and acceptance.

Decisions affecting St David's, Otorohanga, include:

that we be urged to continue to take all practical steps to reduce our carbon footprints and share resources to encourage members of the Church to respond positively to the climate crisis.

that we recognise the 2022 Bi-lingual edition of Te Paipera Tapu as our preferred Bible for use in worship.

that where a presbytery has an ongoing inability to arrange for a minister to be present at meetings of a church council, the presbytery be authorised to permit the church council to meet without a minister for such period as the presbytery decides.

At the opening service, we sang "How great thou art", the first verse in Tokelau, the second in Cook Island Maori, the third in Niuean, and the fourth in Samoan. The chorus was in Maori, and the final verse was in English.


