Christmas is not that far behind us, and I'm sure many of us sang, whistled, hummed – out loud or in our heads, the carol "Silent Night". This was written by Joseph Mohr who lived from 1792 until 1848.

Joseph Mohr was born in the city of Salzburg, Austria. As a boy he was an active chorister in the Cathedral of Salzburg. In 1815 he was or-- dained to the priesthood of the Roman Catholic Church. Following his ordination, he served various parishes in the Salzburg area. It was while serving as an assistant priest in 1818, at the newly erected Church of St Nicholas in Obernorf in the region of Tyrol, high in the Alps, that Mohr wrote the text for this Christmas carol.

 Father Mohr and Franz Gruber, the village school master and church organist, had often talked about the fact that the perfect Christmas hymn had never been written. With this goal in mind, and after he had received word that his own church organ would not function. Father Mohr immediately decided he must write his own Christmas hymn, immediately, to have music for the special Christmas Eve Mass and to avoid disappointing his faithful congregation. Upon completing the text, he took his words to Franz Gruber, who exclaimed when he saw them, "Friend Mohr, you have found it – the right song – God be praised!"

Soon Gruber completed his task of writing the right tune for the new text. His simple but beautiful music blended perfectly with the spirit of Father Mohr's words. This tune is known as "Stille Nacht" The hymn was completed in time for the Christmas Eve Mass, and Father Mohr and Franz Gruber sang it, accompanied by Gruber's guitar. The hymn made a deep impact on the parishioners even as it has on succeeding generations.

Neither Mohr nor Gruber intended that their hymn would be used outside of their little mountain village. However, it is reported that within a • few days after the Christmas Eve Mass, the organ repairman, Karl Maurachen of Zillerthal, a well-known organ builder of that area, came to the church and obtained a copy of the new hymn. Through his influ-• ence the carol spread throughout the entire Tyrol region, where it became popular as a Tyrolean Folk song. It was taken to throughout Austria and Germany by such well-known groups as the Strasser Children's quartet and was first heard in America when a family of Tyrolean Singers – the Rainers, used the music in one of their concert tours.

Attention all Knitters:

Did you know there are people associated with St David's knitting slippers and peggy square blankets for Romania, and baby clothes for the New Born Unit at Waikato Hospital?

The peggy squares are sewn together into blankets. Each square is 8" x 8" and knitted in double knit wool – either new or recycled from op-shop jerseys – unravelled, washed and rolled into balls. When the squares are sewn together, the blankets are collected and taken up to Pirongia where they join with others from throughout the Waikato, are boxed up and sent to Romania.

The baby clothes are all knitted to a given pattern and are then delivlered to the newborn unit at Waikato Hospital.


