I (the Moderator) have in my mind a picture of a braided river, well known to South Islanders. Mighty rivers that carry significant volumes of water in many channels, where a single channel can be a river in itself until it meets another channel, and the scene changes. The connection with the theme is that, as a Church, we can be described metaphorically as a braided river. Alive, directional, flexible, life-giving, unstoppable in our expressions of the Christian faith, unless it becomes disconnected from its source.

'We believe' is about the source, our Lord Jesus Christ. 'We believe' is about the flow of the river through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. 'We believe' is about the banks that hold the braided river, where the Father is hands-on, as it were, moulding and maintaining the river within the boundaries of what we believe.

The moderatorial logo features the Cross from which the braided river flows, with the context prominently displayed, 'We Believe'. It is my prayer that as people engage with the theme at GA25 and during my term as moderator, our unity in Christ will be affirmed.

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From the General Assembly closing address of Moderator Rev • Peter Dunn:

One thing I discovered was that while books were mostly interesting reading with a wealth of information I could digest and ponder upon, it was the Bible that was transformative with its ability through the illumination of the Holy Spirit to change my outlook in an instant.

An example of this was when I was preparing for a sermon a number of years ago. One of the readings was Job 19:23-27. Here is one of the oldest, if not the oldest book in the Bible, speaking about resurrection. Job is in deep lament about his deteriorating physical condition when suddenly and briefly this is written down: "But as for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and he will stand upon the earth at last. And after my body has decayed, yet in my body I will see God! Yes, I will see him for myself. Yes, I will see him with my own eyes. I am overwhelmed at the thought!"

I have always been open and believing in resurrection, but belief in resurrection shifted from thoughts in my head and words spoken from my lips reciting a credal statement to— I suddenly knew in my knower with a deep belief and understanding that God the Redeemer resurrects mortals like me.

Knowing in your knower becomes part of your being. It becomes unshakable, and when a Church makes a "we believe" affirmation about the resurrection knowing in its knower the authenticity, the gates of hell have no power over us. We become sensitized to the truth of the gospel and super-discerning when it comes to those who teach otherwise. Those who teach otherwise in the Church should be challenged. Remember that diversity is not a basis for claiming unity. The person of Jesus Christ and our complete faith in him is when "we believe".

Knowing in our knower. A miracle of God in our lives, a revelation that is so deep that when a Christian community believes together that Jesus is Lord and God raised him from the dead, it creates the climate for miracles.
